1) Biweekly Report

Mr. Morris reviewed the biweekly report, a copy of which is attached.

11. Reports of Committees and Officials:

A) Mayor's Report

Mayor Arroyo spoke about the buses that are going through town. Councilmember Collins reported on a meeting she attended with New Jersey Transit back in February about buses idling. The Police Department has concerns over the turning radius of buses. Borough Administrator Ayer stated that she is trying to set up a meeting with New Jersey Transit and Chief Pontillo within the following week.

Mayor Arroyo brought the issue of sandwich boards up in the commercial district. He stated that sandwich boards are not allowed by sign ordinance, but the downtown businesses felt they were very useful during COVID, and with rising costs and inflation the need to entice customers is real. Mayor Arroyo is asking for a resolution to be passed on a test basis at this time through the end of the year and revisit the Borough Code in November.

Agenda/Public Forum for Sandwich Board Discussion:

Motion to open Agenda/Public Forum: Councilmember Bicocchi Second: Councilmember Collins Voice Vote: A voice vote was taken with all present voting in the Affirmative.

Mike Fitzsimmons spoke about the sandwich boards being safety issues, ending up in streets, having to come in and out at night. There is absence of direction in the code on Zoning Officer to look for issues and problems.

Mayor Arroyo led a discussion about parking in the CBD/SPE areas. He stated that development in all the

surrounding towns means that people will be shopping in Westwood and we need ample parking to accommodate those shoppers. Mayor Arroyo stated that we need to start thinking about how to fund land acquisition and improvements for parking. Suggestions of a parking assessment and a parking trust were also discussed.

B) Council Liaison & Committee Reports

1) Finance, Administration and Capital Projects: BD

Council President Dell brought up the fact that the Borough has been approached by the Westwood Volunteer Ambulance Corps and Trader Joes in Westwood to have food trucks at their respectful events. For the moment the food trucks should be on a case by case basis and as we develop this we can consider charging for permit as well as inspection fees. Council President Dell reports that no one wants to hurt the businesses in Westwood by allowing food trucks but possibly by the parks would be an option.

Agenda/Public Forum for Food Trucks:

Leslie Whyard - stated that having food trucks outside of the CBD like at Westvale Park, not within walking distance to downtown businesses may be the bigger discussion and may encourage businesses in town to invest in buying a food truck themselves.

Mike Fitzsimmons spoke about the idea of bringing outside business to help brick and mortar businesses. The Chamber has discussed having a street fair like Nyack but the attraction is the vendors, not the businesses. Food trucks should be allowed as long as there is no direct conflict in the retail area, and the qualifications and special circumstances are met. He stated he agrees that the food trucks in Westwood needs to be codified and does not agree that it will bring more business to the brick and mortar stores.

Councilmember Greco reports that the fire department is happy with their new fire truck coming soon and they are close to solidifying their bylaws and 501c3. He also reports that the ambulance corps is also excited about their new ambulance and upcoming wetdown.

Councilmember Greco reports that the Heritage Society is excited as they received high school yearbooks from the 1960's and also received Twin Tower paraphernalia from when it opened.

The Senior Advisory Committee was off last month but that they have a jam packed Halloween party coming up where close to 100 people are attending, and the lunch and learns are a great success. Councilmember Greco stated that they were a great bunch and he loves working with them.

3) Health and Hospital: CH

Councilmember Hodges states that the Parking Authority enforcement is after 2pm, and that the word is getting out with that.

Councilmember Hodges stated the electrical contractor has ordered the EV charging station equipment which is about 8-10 weeks out. The Engineer is working on the drawings and will submit for permits when completed.

The Parking Authority/Utility Ordinances will be postponed this meeting.

Councilmember Hodges stated that there was no July BOH meeting but a new manager started last Monday and is acclimating to the position. Gina the Health Officer will be retiring September 1st and they are close to securing her replacement.

Councilmember Hodges also reminded everyone that with food trucks they would need permits and food handling certifications and inspections. Contact the Health Department for more information.

4) Land Use: CM

Councilmember Montana reports that the Planning Board has not met and will meet again on July 28th.

Library Summer Reading continues and participation is up. The visitors online are up by 2k each month over last year, circulation is growing back to prepandemic levels and is rebounding nicely. The Library Finance Committee met with Durene and Elizabeth, trying to get everyone on the same budget page how capital projects work.

Councilmember Montana asked BA Ayer and the Governing Body about LAN Associates evaluating the Library and possibly borough wide departments so we have a handle on what we need to budget for moving forward. Councilmember Bicocchi agreed.

5) Police and OEM: EC

Councilmember Collins welcomes the new officers to the Westwood Police Department and that it is nice to have a big showing in support of them.

September 10th will be the Hayden Smith basketball tournament. September 24th is the Tyrone Softball Tournament, Boots N Badges. Emergency Services night will probably be the first week in September.

The Police Department is currently repairing a high water vehicle for service.

Councilmember Collins reminded everyone to lock their cars and houses. Mayor Arroyo stated that residents are sharing travel information on Facebook or other social media accounts. Do not advertise

when you will be away from your home. Councilmember Collins said do not post vacation pictures in real time, don't leave key fobs, purse in car, lock up and be smart.

Councilmember Collins reports that the Local Assistance is working with the Girl Scouts on a school supply drive which is going very well.

Shade Tree's Facebook page has launched and they planted a Dogwood Tree from Columbia Bank on July 7th. Councilmember Collins is also working to establish a draft ordinance for a tree trust account.

JIF meeting is this Thursday.

Councilmember Collins reviewed the flood meeting that was had with the residents on supporting legislation to help alleviate the flooding.

6) Public Works and Recreation: RB

Councilmember Bicocchi stated that Recreation has 500+ participants and the program is going very well with rain only two days so far. On Thursday the Fire Department will come and wetdown the kids.

The DPW is continuing tree planting and the summer interns have started. The DPW is also working hard at cleaning up after last night's storm.

Councilmember Bicocchi stated there is an Ordinance tonight to bond water sensor radar system. Using technology to warn resident regarding flooding, not depended on other boroughs to warn residents. The system works on solar, gives accurate readings to within 1/8 of an inch in real time.

Councilmember Bicocchi reports that there are new chairs on the dais and there will be outlets installed as well on the dais. Looking for the Clerk's office to go paperless.

911 steel was added to monument and thanked all involved including Councilmember Greco's son and daughter for landscaping.

Hometown Heroes John and Ricardelli are honorees.

D) Attorney's Report

Borough Attorney Kool had no report.

E) Administrator / Clerk's Report

Borough Administrator/CFO Ayer discussed LOSAP increase of \$150. There is enough in the budget and would be an additional \$8,000.00. Also working with the Fire Department to apply for firefighter grant for turnout gear.

Borough Administrator Ayer met with DART today for a consultation on JIF requirement for cyber security. If the Borough is not compliant next year, they may not insure us. Currently there are 6 out of 25 categories that we have to focus on to comply with JIF.
