10. Reports of Committees and Officials:

A) Mayor's Report

i. Resolution #22-235: Authorizing Exceptions to Overnight Parking Prohibition

Mayor Arroyo stated that in the Agenda packet there is a Resolution to memorialize an Overnight Parking Policy. It has been best practice which will now be reduced to writing.

B) Council Liaison & Committee Reports

1) Finance, Administration and Capital Projects: BD

Council President Dell stated that Westwood Fest was a great success. The dunk tank raised \$700 for Westwood Cares, and thanked all dunkees. Sponsorships covered almost all the costs of the event. Council President Dell recognized the Celebrate Westwood team for pulling off an exceptional event.

Council President Dell acknowledged everyone who attended the Haydn Smith Tournament, and congratulated the Police Department Team who won the game.

There are two different movie crews filming in Westwood and they request permission for food trucks. A Resolution will be added to tonight's agenda concerning the same.

Council President Dell participated in a 5G informational zoom session.

Council President Dell stated that the personnel review process is finally completed, and that this process has been a goal of the Personnel Committee for some time.

Council President Dell stated that the CDBG grant opens up soon, and asked for everyone to put some thought into that.

Council President Dell reports that the HPC self-guided walking tour launched and that flyers are available. She is thrilled with the public interaction with the tour. The HPC is in the process of shuffling memberships. If anyone is interested in joining please reach out. The next HPC meeting was changed to October 13th at 7pm.

2) Fire and Ambulance: AG

Councilmember Greco reports that the Fire Department is doing well and had their New Jersey State Fireman's Convention last week where they also attended classes. October 12th is Fire Prevention Week and the Fire Department will be having an Open House and their Inspection Dinner. A Change Order had to be placed for a valve on the new pumper truck. Councilmember Greco also thanked the Fire Department for putting together a team for the Boots and Badges this weekend.

Councilmember Greco reports that the new ambulance wetdown went very well, and that the new ambulance is beautiful, but unfortunately the department is still struggling with membership.

The Heritage Society did very well at the White Elephant Antique Fair. They received maps from 1928 of Westwood. Their Open House was this weekend. They provided a list of Civil War Veterans from Westwood to Councilmember Greco since his son has been cleaning headstones. The Heritage Society is putting together information for the Walking Tour.

Senior Advisory, Councilmember Greco reports that the Halloween party is sold out. They are also having a Crafty Kitchen Field Trip on October 3rd and had a Paramus Park field trip on September 12th.

3) Health and Hospital: CH

Councilmember Hodges said the Board of Health will be holding a rabies clinic on October 15th from 1pm-3pm. The Board of Health is also looking for a location for a flu clinic in October. Public Health Nurse Gina Behr retired. All services under contract are being provided by interim nurse.

The Electric Vehicle charging equipment is on backorder – looks like it will be arriving on October, or November time frame. Blink contract also approved. The Ordinances on Parking Authority changing over to the Utility are postponed again.

4) Land Use: CM

Councilmember Montana reports that the Library will be adding a 3 night of night hours starting in October, and believes it will be on Wednesdays. The third night was suspended during COVID but is now back to its full schedule.

Councilmember Montana thanked Mayor Arroyo for coming to the Environmental Committee Meeting last night. They will be speaking with Ed Sneickus regarding how they can contribute to the risk assessment.

5) Police and OEM: EC

Councilmember Collins reports that the Boots and Badges is this Saturday at Westvale Park. The annual Emergency Services Night is on hold. Councilmember Collins stated that one SLEO II is in the academy and another is being hired but they are in need of dispatchers.

OEM has an upcoming meeting on September 27th with the flood advocacy group, planning on how to engage residents and move forward with legislators.

Shade Tree Committee meeting will be this Thursday at 5:45p.m. This meeting will be discussing the planting process. Certification in October in Chery Hill to qualify members for grant opportunities.

If you see a Lantern Fly, stomp it out!

Councilmember Collins reports that the Local Assistance Board is working on various things. They have teamed up with Celebrate Westwood and thanked those who helped with the process. \$762 was raised for holiday gifts.

6) Public Works and Recreation: RB

Councilmember Bicocchi was proud to be a dunkee at the Westwood Fest.

Recreation Fall Registration has begun and they are in full swing. The Frisbee League will start soon. The community Center kitchen is just about completed and will be a full working commercial kitchen beneficial for renters and Pre-K.

Recreation and DPW bought equipment to pick up debris on fields from leaves to geese droppings.

Councilmember Bicocchi received compliments about the fresh mulch in the dog park. It is a fun place to meet other residents.

Flood sensors have been ordered and will hopefully give residents a better understanding and better communication about flooding once they are installed.

D) Attorney's Report

Borough Attorney Kool had no report.

E) Administrator / Clerk's Report

Borough Administrator Ayer reported that the Agreement with the Dragons for the light towers has been finalized. We also received a request for Berkeley School which will not be charged. Received another request from Hillsdale to borrow for an event at the Swim Club. The suggestion is \$5 a day per light and a policy will be suggested at the next meeting.

Four locations at the Borough Hall were suggested for the placement of the Wifi for good signal for the Borough side of the building.

The Fiber Loop is lit but will have to run additional cables in the Community Center and the Library. Rick will finalize the location in his office and will hopefully be done in a month.

CDBG grant applications have opened so if anyone has any requests please let the Borough Administrator know. Recommendations will be discussed at the October 3rd meeting.

Open Space hearing coming up for Voorhis park request and will hopefully be approved.

Contractors doing work within the Borough have received parking tickets. A form was designed to give to the contractors if they stop in the Clerk's Office for it.

In the absence of a Board of Health Department head, the Borough Administrator acts as the Department Head.

Borough Administrator/CFO Ayer is working with the auditor to address questions for utility. There is a new form of payment for taxes...autopay. The directions for the autopay will be on the next tax bill. The Tax Assessor will work with Borough Administrator Ayer and Borough Attorney Kool to provide tax abatements for rehab program.

The next Borough all staff meeting is this Thursday, which is a session on conflict resolution.

Borough Clerk Hughes reminded the Mayor and Council that the Work Session meeting will be on a Monday.

11. Agenda/Public Forum:

Frank Flossi, 500 Center Avenue – spoke in regards to rent leveling and that there needs to be a cap as people are on fixed incomes.

Rachel Solomon, 30 Charles Street – stated that rents are out of control and landlords continue to gauge. Asking for rent control in the Borough of Westwood. Would like the Mayor and Council to work for the citizens, not the landlords, especially seniors who need the rent cap.

Marlene Mancini, 500 Center Avenue – Originally had a two year lease but now can only get a one year lease and every year there is an increase. There ought to be some way to control exorbitant amounts that tenants are being charged. She stated she was able to argue a fair rate but why should she have to do that, why isn't there a law and why is there such a discrepancy in rates.

Frank Floss – lost 30 cars in the last hurricane and he lost a brand new car, the company never told him there was a flooding issue. Resident would like to know if the Mayor and Council were doing anything to resolve the issue. Councilmember Bicocchi stated that the flood sensors will be a warning system. Mayor Arroyo stated that they are trying through legislation to get the water company to manage water in its reservoir.

Marlene Mancini – stated she was told her car wouldn't flood in the location where she parks but it did and now she lives in fear of having to move her car...please do something about the water. She stated she understands the Council has a lot on their plates but please just help with the rent and water issues in Westwood.

Bill Fuhst, 500 Center – He stated he has lived here for nine years and has lost multiple cars. Unfortunately he gets emergency notification after already being flooded. Mayor Arroyo stated that time of notification is a common complaint. Borough Attorney Kool stated that he will look into where there is a legal obligation to control storm water management on private property.

Rachel Solomon – asked all in favor of rent control to raise their hands, all did, about 15 people in the room. She said no one knew there was a way to complain.

Nancy Robbins, 500 Center Avenue – should there be a sign in parking lot that states it will flood? She lost her car. Mayor Arroyo stated on private property that it was up to the management company and the Borough can't install the sign.

Rachel Solomon said she was here to create new ordinances, rent control, responsibility by management. Westwood can create laws, we can do whatever we want, it just has to be created.

Mayor Arroyo said that we have heard everyone and we will do our homework.


